2021 is a significant milestone for the Duke-NUS alumni as we celebrate the 10th year reunion of our pioneer class, and two classes celebrate their graduations in the same year - an in-person second-go-around for the Class of 2020 and a virtual one for the Class of 2021! Alumni events this year focused on our alumni's personal and professional development. President's Message

To my dearest fellow alumni,

K.O.K.O., Four letters my high-school economics professor and personal mentor used to encourage me and my friends. **Keep On Keeping On**, a simple yet effective catchphrase to remind us to chug along when seemingly insurmountable challenges wore us down. The growing pains of high school are now from a distant past and it's been a while since I last spoke to my professor, but his advice still helps me get through my daily tasks, especially in these recent years with the unpredictability of the COVID situation.

I am proud to say that despite the many limitations, our alumni have also kept on keeping on through the COVID pandemic. Dr Paul Tan, my classmate and cycling buddy, won the National Outstanding Clinical Scientist Resident Award and Dr Wu Hong King, our previous DNMA committee member, won the Singapore Health Quality SuperHero award for 2021! Other than these major awards, many of our alumni have also achieved career milestones despite the pandemic. 24 of us have completed residency training, some have cleared major exams and progressed into senior residency. 36 of our junior alumni have also been accepted into the various competitive residency programs. Outside of work, I also frequently hear colleagues and friends achieving personal milestones, getting married, getting their new house, having kids, and starting new relationships.

This year marked the 10th anniversary of our pioneering class's graduation. I had the opportunity to witness this class in action as students when I was one myself and from then until now, they never fail to inspire me with their fire and their drive to break barriers. We will forever be grateful for the roads they have paved for us, moulding the residency program in its birthing years and fighting for rights of junior doctors ever since they were house officers! I am also personally indebted to my predecessor, Dr Chia Ghim Song, who set the building blocks for DNMA. 



NEW E-VENTS: YOGA SESSION AND TRIVIA NIGHT

On 23rd September 2020, we organised another virtual event for our alumni: a mid-week Yoga session, with Jen Wui Quan (Class of 2023) as our instructor for the evening. We extended the invitation to students and members of the Alumni Relations team joined in as well. We need only prepare our own mats to learn basic yoga in just half an hour. For some of us, it was our first time trying out yoga and it was a very therapeutic and rewarding session.



In December 2020, we organised our first ever Trivia Night for alumni and students. Alumni and students signed up in groups of five and some of them even met up face-to-face for a good meal before the event (while adhering to Phase 2 guidelines). It was a very enjoyable night and the competition was neck-to-neck, with an alumni team emerging victorious and two other teams clinching joint 2nd.

CONVERSATION WITH PROF OOI ENG EONG

On 19th October 2020, we invited alumni and students for a conversation with Prof Ooi Eng Eong, the co-director of the Viral Research And Experimental Medicine Centre at SingHealth Duke-NUS (ViREMiCS). Prof Ooi kick-started the session by introducing us to his research experience in dengue and other Aedes-borne flaviviruses, and the development and evaluation of novel therapeutics and vaccines. Of course, all of us were especially interested in learning more about his work involving COVID-19 and a vaccine for it, and it was especially valuable and inspiring to have the principle investigator who is developing a self-replicating mRNA COVID-19 vaccine (in partnership with Arcturus Therapeutics) to share with us his journey and insights.





On 26 March 2021, we organised a virtual leather-crafting workshop, where our alumni and their loved ones had a fun hour making a creative craft piece. Having experienced several other virtual events over the past year, we wanted to try something hands-on, and being able to put the end-products to good use after the event. The workshop started with some fun facts about leather before we went ahead with making our own coin pouches and key fobs.

LEATHER CRAFTING NORKSHOP AND PERSONAL FINANCE TALK

Another novel 2021 e-vent we organised was a much-requested talk about personal finance for our alumni and MS4 students. Our speaker was none other than Yong Jie, who is part of the Alumni Relations team, and he tailored the talk to address some of the most pressing concerns and questions that our alumni and students had. Listing six steps, he explained what good personal finance is and how we can achieve and maintain finance independence.




HEALTH & WEALTH SERIES

This year, from April to August, we collaborated with NUS BIZAlum office to run a Health & Wealth Series for alumni from both faculties. This is Duke-NUS Alumni Relations' first formal collaboration with another alumni group within NUS.

The first part was a five part Positive Psychology series with Dr Mara McAdams, conducted fortnightly, from April to June. Dr Mara introduced Positive Psychology as a tool to enhance wellbeing and resilience. Each session included a didactic lecture and a practice, and there was also a WhatsApp group for participants to share their experiences with the practices.





The second part of the Health and Wealth Series is the "Improve Your Financial Health" programmes. The first session "Understanding and improving your financial health" was by Mr Kenneth Lou (NUS BBA '17), the cofounder and CEO of Seedly, a fintech start-up which has grown to become Singapore's biggest personal finance community. The second session "Real Estate – Your Investment Strategy Matters" was a talk on real estate investment by Ms Julia Goh (NUS BBA '97), the Associate Division Director of Propnex Realty, who shared her extensive experience in a wide range of real estate transactions in private residential properties.

NATIONAL OUTSTANDING CLINICIAN SCIENTIST RESIDENT AWARD

Outstanding Clinician Scientist Resident Award. The award, first introduced in 2017, recognises Clinician Scientist Residents for their outstanding performance and contribution in clinical training and research to improve patient care. It is given to only two clinician scientist residents each year and out of the eight recipients so far, four are Duke-NUS alumni. Dr Paul Tan's research focuses on improving the way analgesics are administered to better meet the pain relief needed by individual patients through better prediction before surgery or childbirth and developing technology so that patient experiences, efficiency and outcomes can be improved.



Alumni Survey 2020

187 of 440 alumni (42.5%) responded to our alumni survey in 2020. This is the highest response rate for the Biannual Survey thus far, giving us valuable feedback and information about their current and intended involvement in research and leadership positions, and their aspirations for a Clinician Plus career. This survey also helps us plan for ways that we can continue to assist our alumni in their

graduates were active in research, as evidenced by academic output, some with research output in multiple categories.

75 graduates (40%) have served in a leadership capacity in the past two years. The types of roles include research protocol guideline development, residency committee member, hospital committee member, Duke-NUS Medical Alumni committee member and others (QI project leader, COVID-related policy).
